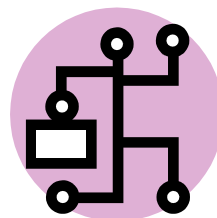
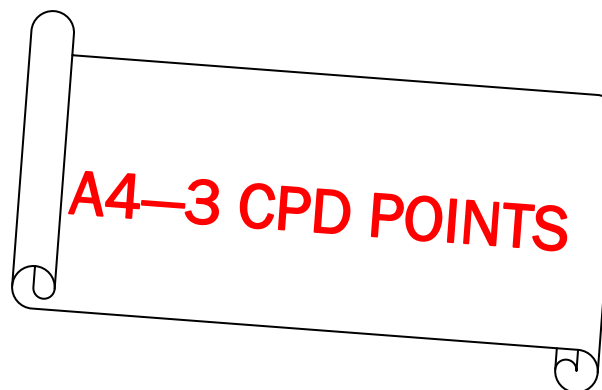

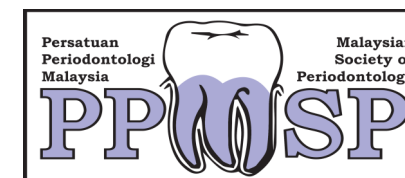

Dr. Yap is a Specialist Periodontist, currently practising at Unit Pakar Periodontik, Mentakab. She is a graduate from Manipal University with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery degree (BDS). She then underwent specialty training in Periodontology and Implant Surgery at King's College London, Guy's Dental Institute, where she has successfully achieved a Master of Clinical Dentistry degree in Periodontology with Distinction. Dr. Yap has also obtained the Membership of the Faculty of Dental Surgery (MFDS RCSEd) as well as Membership in Periodontics (MPerio RCSEd) from the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh.

### The effect of smoking on periodontal health. How much do you know?

Risk factors play a significant role in maintaining the periodontium in health or disease. Well-documented evidence indicates that tobacco smoking is one of the most important risk factors in the development and progression of periodontal disease as it modifies the host immune-inflammatory response. So, what are the evidences available? How do we manage smokers with periodontitis? What shall we do if patients are not ready to quit smoking? Does periodontal treatment work in those patients? What is the likely outcome after periodontal treatment? Electronic cigarettes have been gaining popularity among certain population worldwide in recent years. What is vaping? What do we know?

This presentation will highlight and discuss on the identification and management of smokers with periodontal disease in our daily practice as well as to share some insight on the effect of vaping on the periodontium based on the current research.

Dr Munirah received her dental degree from University of Science Malaysia (USM) in 1999 and completed her Master degree in Periodontology from University of Sheffield (UoS) in 2011. She is currently serves as clinical lecturer in International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) for 7 years. Dr Munirah has research interest in periodontal medicine and regenerative surgery. Focus of the moment are on UG teaching and training and local delivery antibiotic in periodontitis research.

### Role of general dental practitioner in management of periodontal disease

The main role of dentist is to increase the lifespan of dentition by means of disease prevention or thorough treatment. Advancements in periodontology have given success to periodontal diagnosis and treatment plan. Although most of dental institutes provide good quality education in dentistry, the specialty education is limited to the curriculum during undergrads. There is still a number of patients visiting the GDP lacks of appropriate periodontal treatment. This lecture will highlight on the management of periodontal cases in primary care level.

Obtained her First Degree in Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) from USM in 2006 and completed Master of Restorative (Periodontic) in 2014 also from USM. She also was conferred with a Fellowship from the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (FRACDS) in 2013. Currently she is a periodontist in Unit Pakar Periodontik Klinik Pergigian Paya Besar, Kuantan, Pahang. Her field of interest are mainly periodontal plastic & regenerative surgery and implant.

### Sharing the local clinical cases of Aggressive Periodontitis

Aggressive periodontitis is characterized by a rapid loss of clinical attachment and alveolar bone, which primarily but not exclusively affects younger patients. Previously named "juvenile periodontitis", aggressive periodontitis occurs in localised and generalised form according to the extent of the periodontal destruction (AAP, 1999). The nature of the disease which is 'painless' at the early phase prompting late presentation with more destructive effects which end up with multiple tooth loss. Speaker will share her experience managing Aggressive Periodontitis cases which is found in a significant number in her previous practice. Majority of the patients presented with severe bone loss and multiple tooth loss at the early middle age. The challenging part is to restore the loss of function and esthetic components. Most of the cases will need multidisciplinary approaches and clinicians should aware their responsibility in managing severe type of periodontitis.

### When and how to refer to a periodontist?

Periodontal diseases have a global distribution, which include a broad spectrum of severity ranging from mild gingivitis to advanced periodontitis. In Malaysia, 18% of adult population affected by severe periodontal disease (NOHSA, 2010) which require more complex treatment. General dental practitioners are at the frontline of the community dental service, play an important role in detection, prevention and managing periodontal disease. The use of proper screening method on regular basis will result in the detection and eventually treatment of the disease. This lecture will highlight on the detection and types of periodontal cases which can be referred.
